## **TRANSFER PROVISIONS**

Students must complete 120 credits to obtain a bachelor's degree. A maximum of 90 combined nontraditional learning, prior learning, and transfer credits may be accepted and applied toward the 120 credit requirement. Within the 90 credit maximum, a maximum of 75 credits of nontraditional credit, including a maximum of 30 credits of prior learning, may be applied towards a bachelor's degree. Official transfer credit evaluation takes place once a student is enrolled at Ashford University, and all official transcripts have been received. Washington and Oregon residents may apply a maximum of 30 credits toward a bachelor's degree from any combination of prior learning assessment or other nontraditional learning, including national testing programs, or credit recommendation services.
