Purpose Statement: Provide a specific and accurate synopsis of the overall purpose of the study. Align the Purpose of the Study to address the specific research problem. In one concise paragraph, succinctly describe the focus, methodology, population, and geographical location of the study.

To complete the Purpose Statement, answer the following questions:
Identify the Purpose of Your Study (what do you hope to accomplish?):
Identify the General and Specific Populations That Will Be Involved in Your Study
Identify the Setting or Geographical Location for Your Study:
Identify Your Proposed Research Method (quantitative or qualitative or mixed
methods):
Identify Your Research Design ¹ (and sub-Design, if applicable):
